Okewill Wood presents a rare opportunity to own a breathtaking ancient, semi-natural oak woodland with panoramic views over the Devon countryside. Nestled at the top of a hill at the end of a shared woodland track, it is completely secluded, far from any roads—an ideal retreat.

While majestic oaks dominate the landscape, the woodland is rich with diversity, including ash, hazel, beech, birch, and holly. The terrain is generally easy to navigate, though some areas are steep. Wide rides cut through the center, and winding woodland paths lead to points of interest.

The main camp area is open and level, perfect for summer stays with family and friends. A well-built compost loo offers a scenic view, and a caravan provides shelter on rainy days. Wildlife thrives here, with deer frequently

The village of Bratton Fleming is within walking distance via a public footpath, while Barnstaple, a charming river-port town, is just a short drive away. For those drawn to the coast, North Devon's stunning beaches and coastal trails are easily accessible.

The ward is Bratton Fleming and the county council is Devon.

Boundaries: The boundary is fenced to the south and borders neighbouring woodland. North follows an old stone wall and fenced outlooking open fields. East borders neighbouring woodland and is marked with paint on stakes or trees.

Access: Vehicle access is possible with a 4X4 via a shared locked gate. Parking is possible within the woodland.


Covenant: There is a covenant on the wood designed to ensure the quiet and peaceful enjoyment of this and adjoining woodlands, click **HERE** to read and download.



Okewill Wood, Button Lane, Bratton Fleming, Devon

- 1. Click here for Bing Maps Directions click on the "Directions" box and enter your own postcode.
- For viewing purposes, please park in the turning area at the main entrance as marked on the map. Please don't block the gate.
- Pass by the metal gate on the left and follow the track through the meadow, marked blue on the map.
- Follow the track for approx 1000m (about 10 minutes) bearing right at the second set of gates. You will reach a fallen oak as pictured no.4 in the images. At this point bear right and continue up the hill. After 180m you will enter Okewill Wood.
- Alternatively, if you don't have a suitable car for green lanes park in Bratton Fleming and follow the public footpath.
- 2. **For Satnav**, the nearest postcode is **EX31 4SD** as the map marker shows. The main coordinates for access are: **51.131303**, **-3.948852**. **W3W**: //unroll.shades.scorching
- 3. We recommend downloading OS maps to your phone. It's very useful for giving you an idea of where you are on the ground when viewing woodlands.
